<p>Additional information:</p> <p>The principal didactic material used will be the CAE Oxford Aviation Academy AGK Powerplant book. Based upon experience the best option is a paper copy, so that notes can be made over that material. Those students that wish to use (against my better judgement) the digital format may do so, keeping in mind that any use of the digital medium for anything not related to the specific Oxford book will be met with the corresponding sanction. In the interest of a more thorough understanding of the learning objectives, additional material in the form of photocopies will be handed out to the students. Both sources should be equally considered when reviewing material.</p> <p>After approximately 28 classes we will complete Progress Test 1 over the material covered, keep in mind the mark requirements for ponderation in the “Guia Docente de Adventia: Grado Universitario”, Edition September 2018. Once the ponderations for the three areas of evaluation have been combined following the criteria in the “guia docente”, the Final Mark will be determined.</p> <p>Additional Considerations:</p> <p>The mark for active participation in class will be given based upon student involvement in discussion, student attentiveness, and a positive attitude toward learning the material.</p> <p>The mark for additional work will be given based upon student performance in completing the following criteria: Choose one of the chapters covered during the course and in three or four type written pages (Arial 11, single spaced) describe the chosen subject. Technical accuracy is very important as is the use your own words, if the work is just cut and paste it won't reflect your level of learning, this is the ultimate goal of this project. Images may be very helpful in the presentation but shouldn't compile a major part of the paper. Accurate sources other than the Oxford book may be used as references and don't forget to put your name and Student Number on the report. The completeness, accuracy and personal involvement in the development of your report will be evaluated to determine the mark received. The work must be submitted in hard copy (no e-mail) on or before the date of the Progress Test for the Course.</p>
